



In the summer of 2025, the town of Roccella Jonica, nestled on the eastern coast of Calabria, Italy, will host two interconnected initiatives exploring the evolving intersections of law, justice, and political economy. Supported by the Municipality of Roccella, these collaborative events aim to foster critical thinking, inclusive dialogue, and community engagement in an inspiring Mediterranean setting.

2025 ROCCELLA SUMMER SCHOOL OF INTERNATIONAL LAW (16-17 JULY)

The Roccella Summer School is a dynamic short course on International Law held biannually in Roccella since 2021. The School centres around a broad theme, inspired by pressing social, geopolitical and legal developments, and aims to create an accessible and inclusive space for people from all backgrounds to engage in meaningful conversations on the role of international law for the peaceful coexistence and the thriving of humanity. This year's two-day programme will feature three workshops (16 July) and two keynote lectures (17 July) by exceptional guests.

The School is organised by Raffaella Nigro (University Magna Græcia of Catanzaro) and Emma Luce Scali (University of Manchester) and is funded by the University Magna Græcia of Catanzaro, its Department of Law, Economics and Sociology (DIGES),

and the DIGES Research Centre 'Autonomie Territoriali Europee', and has received the support of the Department of Law at the University of Manchester.

2025 GLOBAL LAW AND POLITICAL ECONOMY SUMMER ACADEMY (14-17 JULY)

Running in parallel, the Global Law and Political Economy Summer Academy offers an interactive, non-hierarchical, and focused mentorship and skill-building experience for students and faculty interested in critically engaging with the diverse considerations of political-economy-law while fostering democratic dialogue with local cultures. This year's programme will include roundtable discussions, writing workshops, and a cultural excursion (15 July), a case study session and a master class (16 July), and will conclude with a career mentorship session and participation in the keynote lectures of the Roccella Summer School (17 July).

The Summer Academy is a collaboration between the INET YSI FLE Working Group, the Law and Political Economy Collective (LPE-C), the Initiative for Global Law and Political Economy at the University of Manchester (iGLPE), and the European Association for Evolutionary Political Economy (EAEPE).

Both the School's and the Academy's sessions will take place in Roccella's extraordinary historical venues: the 12th-century 'Palazzo Carafa' and its 'Chiesa Matrice', and the 16th-century 'Convento dei Minimi di San Francesco da Paola'.
